- 9:00 a.m. school begins. Students are counted as tardy at 9:00. Have your child at school by 8:55 so they have time to transition to class.
- 3:38 p.m. school dismisses.
- No early release days this year

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

For the safety of our students, families and staff, please follow these procedures for arrival and dismissal.

Arrival Times

- If students are eating breakfast at school, they may enter door #1 at 8:35.
 There is no supervision until that time.
- Breakfast-Served between 8:35-8:55 a.m.
- The Rousseau campus will be closed until <u>8:50</u> a.m. No supervision is available unless they are going to breakfast.
- 8:50-8:55
 - Kindergarteners will line up by door 1
 - 1st 5th grade will line up on the playground. Due to safety concerns, no parents are allowed on the playground during this time.
- Students arriving at the building after 9:00 a.m. must go to door #1
- School begins at 9:00 a.m.

Traffic Flow

So many great changes have been made with our drop off and pick-up areas. Safety is our primary concern. One important aspect of safety is traffic flow during critical drop-off and pick-up times. The success of our plan is dependent on adherence to our new procedures. Here are the things you need to know:



Arrival Procedures

Parents can drop off their children in two areas in front of the school. One of them is the cut-out area on 33rd Street. The other is the drive-through lane on school property.

- Cut-out area on 33rd Street:
 - Parents will need to be watchful when going into the drive-through lane on 33rd.
 - If there is not a drop-off space open by the sidewalk to let their child exit the car, the parent will need to circle around the block.
- Drive-through lane on school property:

- Please have your child ready to exit the car on the right side.
- o Parents should not get out of the car.
- o Traffic needs to keep flowing in this lane.
- Pull up as far as possible.
- Pay attention to the staff directing traffic and follow their directions.
- o Cars will not be allowed to double park in the drive through lane.
- Please do not block the north parking lot.
- If a parent/guardian is needing to get out of their vehicle, they will need to use a parking space in the north parking lot or along the streets where parking is allowed.
- There are two parking lots for staff. (South side of the drive-through lane and the west side of the school) Parents are not allowed to enter the staff parking lots to drop off or pick up students.
- Do not use the bus lane on Calvert street. It is reserved for buses, daycares and students with special needs.
- DO NOT LET CHILDREN OUT IN THE MIDDLE OF THE STREET.
- DO NOT CROSS IN THE MIDDLE OF THE STREET.
- Use the crosswalk.
- 8:50-8:55
 - o Kindergarteners will line up by door 1
 - o 1st 5th grade will walk the walking path

Dismissal Procedures

- Teachers will escort all students out their designated exit door at 3:38 p.m.
- All students must go directly home, to daycare, or to a school sanctioned activity after dismissal.
- Parents should arrange to pick up their child(ren) outside at the same location each day.
- Students who are not picked up will be brought back in the building at 3:45.
- Phone calls will be made if a child is still at school past 3:45 for any reason.
- If there is an emergency, parents are required to call if they will be late picking up their child or if there is a change of plans
- Our School Campus (including the playground) is closed until 6:00 p.m. except for use by Family Service and clubs.

Dismissal Locations

- Before the first day, please make plans with your child where they should meet after school.
- If you have multiple children, designate a meeting place or plan.

- You may bring lunch for your child only.
- You may not bring lunch for another child.
- If another guest is going to eat with your child, please call the office to allow permission.
- Lunch CANNOT be delivered by an outside establishment. (Jimmy Johns, Grub Hub...)

• Due to safety reasons, parents/guests are not allowed to attend recess after lunch.

Before and After School Care

Before and after school care is available to families at Rousseau School for a fee through Family Service by calling (402)441-7949. Other center-based and home daycares are located in the neighborhood. Information is available on the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department website or by calling (402) 441-8026.

Communication

School Messenger will be the main communication between school and families, as well as our <u>Rousseau Website</u> and the <u>Rousseau Facebook page</u>. The Rousseau Ram Report is a monthly newsletter that will be sent to families electronically.

Student Handbook

You will be receiving a paper copy of the student handbook (calendar)the first week of school. Here is a digital copy as a reference as well. It is also found on the LPS website.

Important Information Booklet

Each year Lincoln Public Schools provides all our families with a compilation of what we call the "Important Information Booklet," a collection of essential and helpful guidelines, rules, procedures and tips for your students in the coming school year. There will be a postcard in the summer mailing packet with more information. You can find the Important Information Booklet on the LPS webpage.

On the same webpage as Important Information, parents also will find links to school student handbooks and common practices for elementary, middle and high schools. We believe this will be a more effective and useful process for all our families, as well as serve as a wise use of school district resources.

The following areas are in the "Important Information Handbook" that I want to remind you of.

Birthday Invitations-Classrooms recognize birthdays in a variety of ways. Students are not allowed to bring birthday treats (edible or non edible). Please do not send gifts, party favors, balloons, or flowers. These items will not be delivered to classrooms. Invitations will not be distributed during the school day. Teachers should be notified ahead of time if a student has invitations to distribute after school. Phone numbers and addresses cannot be distributed by any school personnel. Rousseau staff will



not be available to help distribute these after school because they are

supervising students. If parents would like addresses for students, they may contact the office and purchase a directory for \$5.

Pets-For the safety and well-being of students, parents, community members and staff, pets/personal companion animals are not allowed to be brought on school grounds when students are present except in accordance with Policy 3972. Having your pet in the car with you or waiting off school property when you pick up your child is acceptable.



 CELL PHONE AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES - Cell phones, smart watches, and other personal electronic devices are considered nuisance items if heard or used during the school day. If personal electronic devices are brought to

school, they should be kept in their backpack, locker, or location designated by school staff during the school day. Smart watches can be worn as long as they are used as a standard watch. If smart watches are used for any other function, they will be treated the same as other personal electronic devices, and the student will be asked to keep the device in a backpack, locker, or other location designated by school



staff. The school is not responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen devices. Please note that it is unlawful, and therefore prohibited on school grounds, to take a picture or record audio or video of another person without their consent. If your child needs to bring their cell phone to school, they are welcome to bring it to the office and we will keep it safe for them.





A NEW FREE AND REDUCED MEAL APPLICATION IS REQUIRED EACH SCHOOL YEAR. Families who may be eligible for free or reduced-price meal benefits <u>must submit a new application each new school year (July 1 or after)</u> to determine eligibility. You must reapply each new school year.

ONLINE FREE AND REDUCED APPLICATION WILL BE AVAILABLE JULY 22nd: The free and reduced meal application will be available online at LPS.org. The online application is fast and secure, and takes only one to two working days to process. When you apply online and have an email address registered with LPS, you will receive an email notification as soon as your application has been processed. Families who received a letter this summer from Lincoln Public Schools Nutrition Services Department stating that their children have been Direct Certified for free or reduced meal benefits do not need to complete an application. Please make sure all the school age children in your home are included in this letter. If one or more of your children are not listed, please call the Nutrition Services office at 402-436-1746. Paper applications may take as long as ten (10) working days to process. Nutrition Services is not responsible for lost paper applications. Free and reduced meal benefits may allow a family to receive fee waiver benefits.

PRE-PAYMENTS: Can be made online by following the link on the LPS homepage and clicking "Buy Student Meals" or by sending payment with your student to school. Many parents enjoy the convenience of depositing money into cafeteria accounts using the online prepayment system. Registered users may add funds for all students in their family at one time using this system. Purchases may be made using either your checking account information or VISA, MasterCard or Discover credit cards (nominal transaction fees apply). Cash or check are accepted at each school. If you choose to send cash or check with your student, please include a note indicating your student's name and student ID number.

MEAL CHARGES: No student will be denied a school meal if their meal account is zero or negative. The student will be served from the regular menu and the appropriate meal price (reduced or paid) will be added to the student account. If the student's account is zero or negative, the student may not charge a second meal, an extra entrée or any a la carte items. Families are encouraged to regularly check their account balance and track their child's spending to prevent negative meal balances. It is the responsibility of the student's family to provide the funds for the child's meal. Negative balances are expected to be paid in full each school year. When negative balances reach \$10 or more families will receive notification of charges via a Negative Balance letter or automated phone call. Automated phone calls will continue until the negative balance has been paid. Unpaid meal charges are carried over at the end of the school year. The negative balance will remain in the school meal software until it is three years past due. After three years the negative meal balance will be moved to the student's account in the student information system (Synergy). It is important to keep contact information (address, email and phone number) current with LPS.

LPS ONLINE MENUS: MealViewer is the online tool LPS uses to post menus for all schools. View menus on your computer by visiting the LPS homepage and clicking on "School Menus". Schools are listed alphabetically. Create your own profile by saving your student's school, or simply "X" to bypass this option and go straight to the menus. Download the mobile app for menu information on the go. Search for "MealViewer to Go" in the App Store or Google Play Store.

FOOD ALLERGIES OR SPECIAL DIETS FOR MEDICAL REASONS: The "Medical Statement for Students Requiring Special Meals" is available online at **LPS.org**. This form must be completed, signed by a Physician and faxed to Nutrition Services (402-436-1775) or dropped off at your child's school. After submitting the form, please plan to send a meal with
